



Greater New Haven Area Subcommittee Meeting Times & Locations

There is no clean time requirement to attend any subcommittee meeting!

Activities: meets the 3rd Sunday of every month at 4:30 pm
St. Bernadette's Church, 385 Townsend Avenue, New Haven, CT
(Responsible for fun events such as annual comedy show, marathon meetings, speaker jams, spring breakfast, walk the walk, etc. etc.)

Hospitals & Institutions (H&I): meets the last Sunday of every month at 5:00pm
(orientation at 4:30pm is required for first time attendees)
Yale Health Center, 55 Lock Street, New Haven, CT
(Brings the Narcotics Anonymous message of recovery to addicts who cannot attend a regular meeting such as addicts in jails and institutions.)

Literature: meets the 1st Sunday before ASC meeting of every month at 3:30pm
Chrisam's Business Center, 315 Boston Post Rd, Old Saybrook, CT
(Supplies books, readings, pamphlets, IP's, & schedules to all of our meetings in the New Haven area and our subcommittees)

Public Relations: meets the 1st Saturday of every month at 12:00pm (*following No Excuses Meeting of NA*)
Yale Health Center, 55 Lock Street, New Haven, CT
(The voice behind the 1-800 number on the front of our schedules, brings information into schools, posts flyers in our community, does mailings, and is behind "mobile meetings" where a meeting is brought to an addict that cannot get to one. (IE in the hospital, too ill to get out))

Greater New Haven Area Service Committee (GNHASC): meets on the 1st Monday of every month (unless that Monday falls on a holiday) at 7:00pm
Grace and St Peter's Church, 2927 Dixwell Avenue, Hamden, CT
(AKA Area. This is where Group Service Representatives (GSR) meets to conduct Greater New Haven Area business and this subcommittee serves each individual meeting in our area.)

Note: *Because of various factors a meeting date or location may be moved or changed. If so, the change will be noted in the previous month's sub-committee report or in the previous month's minutes from the GNHASC meeting.*
