



H&I Chair Report for February 2016

I attended Regional H&I in New Britain on Wednesday 2-3-16 with the Vice-Chair and gave the area report. I learned that the regional H&I budget passed and that a new line item of \$1000 was added for travel to conferences that could benefit Connecticut H&I committees. The Regional H&I Apparel committee still owes the Region \$206.00 for the t-shirts and sweatshirts it had made last year. The shirts are available for purchase or to bring to local H&I learning days. We are attempting to re-pay the Region before asking for money for new shirts. We are currently looking for artwork to be submitted for shirt designs.
